Colour in the circles or decorate the board game in whatever way you wish.

Now you're ready to play A Day in the Life of Judy Moody! The rules are:


- If you roll a 1, you are Stuck Forever in Third Grade and do not advance.

- If you roll a 3, you get a "Good Job" sticker from Mr Todd (of Class 3T) and get to move on 3 spaces.






- If you roll a 4, you catch someone littering and get to move the player of your choice back 2 spaces.
