BUNGO'S TEAM

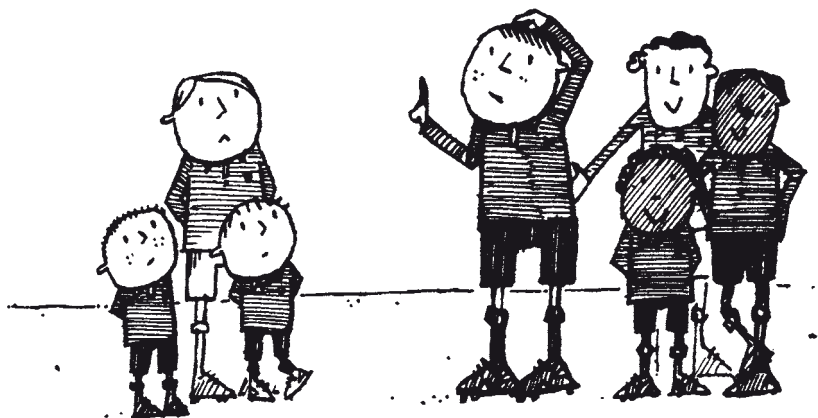


“It is the school five-a-side World Cup Day for our year, and we’re going to win it!” said Bungo. “I’m calling us Bungo’s Team.”

There were seven squad players for each team to pick from. That was five in the team, and two subs, so everyone would get a game, even the tinies like Titch and Cosmo.

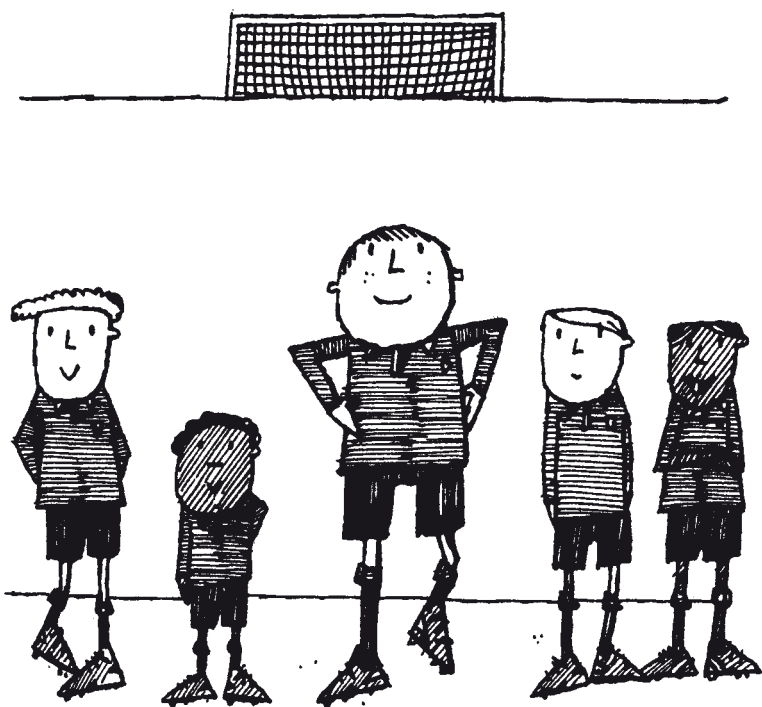


Bungo picked himself first. Then he picked Dunky and Ravi and Leroy. That made four, but it was *five-a-side*.
