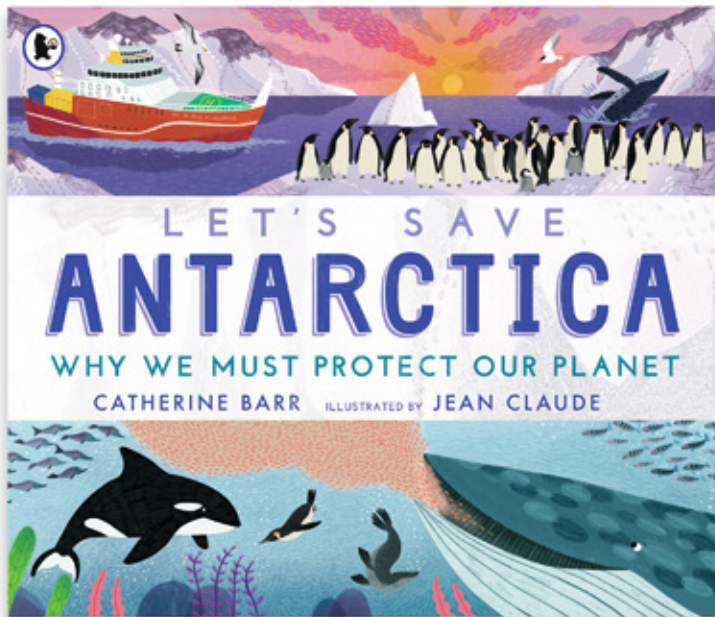


LET'S SAVE SERIES

LET'S SAVE ANTARCTICA



One of the threats to Antarctica is plastic pollution. Even though no one lives permanently on Antarctica, Scientists have discovered tiny fragments of microplastic frozen into the ice showing how far human pollution has spread. Tiny krill swallow microplastics in the ocean and then are eaten by larger animals such as whales. Whales, seals and penguins can also get tangled in plastic waste. Design a poster which shows six ways you can reduce the use of plastic at home and school.

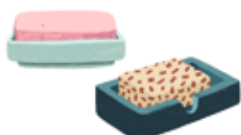

LET'S SAVE THE OKAVANGO DELTA

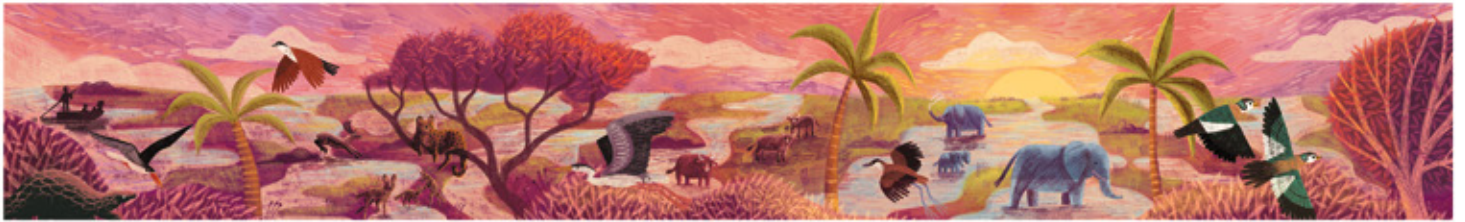

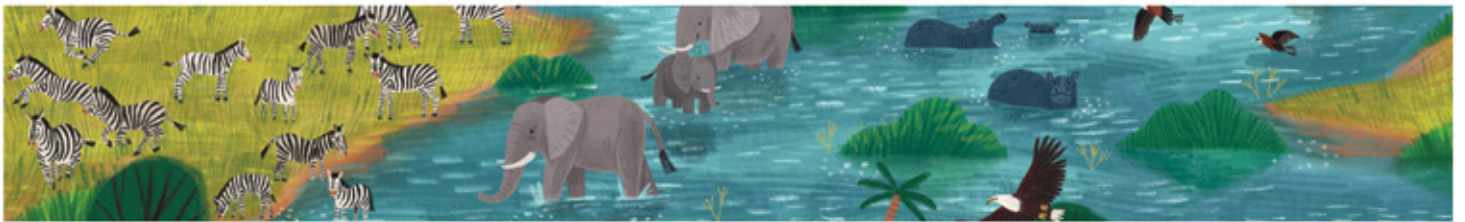

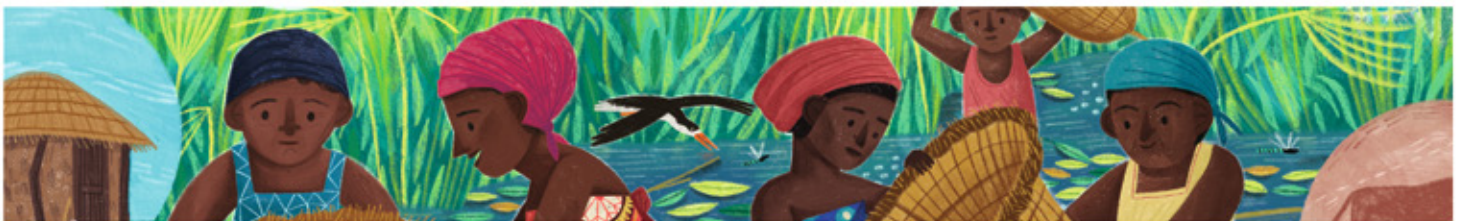
